Colossians Part X – Embracing Redemption

Summary

In this sermon, we explore Colossians 4:7-9 and the story of Onesimus, which leads us to the book of Philemon. The central theme is the supremacy of Christ and the transformative power of His grace. Paul, writing from prison, sends Onesimus back to Philemon, urging the church to accept him as a brother in Christ despite his past. This narrative challenges us to embrace the redemptive work of Jesus in others, even when it is difficult, and to extend grace and forgiveness as we have received from God.
