

2025-02-09 - Freedom of the Spirit: Understanding Spirit-Led Worship in the Free Methodist Church

Summary

The sermon discusses the third 'free' in Free Methodist tradition - the freedom of the Spirit. The pastor explains how early Free Methodists moved away from rigid liturgical practices to embrace more spontaneous, Spirit-led worship. This freedom allows for various expressions of worship and believes that God's Spirit can move and speak in unexpected ways, while still maintaining biblical truth as the foundation.

3. What role does community play in helping us understand the Spirit's leading?
4. How can we balance being open to the Spirit's movement while maintaining biblical truth?
5. What fears or hesitations might people have about Spirit-led worship?
6. How has the Holy Spirit's guidance impacted your own spiritual journey?
7. What's the difference between religious restrictions and true spiritual freedom?
8. How can we create an environment that welcomes both structure and spontaneity in worship?

Life Application

This week, take time each day to intentionally quiet yourself and listen for the Holy Spirit's guidance. Journal about what you sense God saying to you and share your experience with at least one other person from the group.
